Associate of Arts/Science to Bachelor of Elementary Education Articulation Agreement 2+2 Elementary Education

The State of Idaho has made substantial progress in creating multiple pathways for people to access higher education. Increased attention is given to preparing Idaho's high school students to pursue post-secondary education upon graduation from high school and renewed focus has been placed on enhancing Idaho's educational infrastructure such that Idaho's working adults can more easily access higher education opportunities. Lewis-Clark State College (LC State) and the College of Eastern Idaho (CEI), two robust, student-centered institutions, seek to expand these efforts even further.

College of Eastern Idaho (CEI) and Lewis-Clark State College (LC State) enter into this articulation agreement to facilitate the transfer of CEI associate degrees to LC State's Bachelor of Elementary Education. Under the provisions of this agreement, CEI associate degree graduates will be granted admission to LC State and will have third year (junior) standing.

****Programs such as education, nursing, and social work require additional application processes. Admission to programs with separate application processes is not guaranteed under the provisions of this agreement.***

Upon completion of the Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree at CEI, academic credit/courses taken at CEI will be transferred to LC State. Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree will be considered core certified and, unless a specific core-level class is required for a specific baccalaureate program, will have satisfied all lower-level core requirements.



For the purposes of this agreement, a student may select any edition of the Lewis-Clark State College General Catalog, provided that the catalog was published and was in force while the student was enrolled at CEI and provided that the catalog is no older than seven (7) academic years at the time of graduation from LC State.

Provisions

- LC State agrees to offer in-person and remote/virtual information sessions to CEI students. CEI agrees to promote these opportunities to CEI students, faculty, and staff. For in-person events, CEI agrees to provide conference or meeting space at no charge to LC State.
- LC State agrees to provide CEI academic leadership and advising staff with annual updates on curriculum changes, including changes in specific program requirements.
- LC State and CEI agree to coordinate meetings between selected faculty and staff to develop, review, or update program-specific articulation agreements. The meetings will take place at least once per year.
- LC State and CEI agree to promote this articulation agreement and any program-specific articulations agreements via their web sites.
- Additional Provisions
 - A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required for admission into the Elementary Education Program.
 - Grade of B- or better in all upper division coursework.
 - Elementary Education Program applications are due by 1st Friday of Fall or Spring semester.
 - Background checks are required of all students (included in ED 214 at LC State).
 - Students must pass the required Praxis Exam(s) prior to full admission to the Elementary Education program (required for internship).

Conditions

- Students must provide LC State with documentation (official transcript) proving successful completion of the Associate of Arts (AA), or Associate of Science (AS) at CEI.
- Completion of the Associate of Arts, (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree provides a guaranteed transfer of credit to the college but does not guarantee completion of any specific department/major requirements unless identified in a program-specific agreement.
- Admission to specific areas of study may be dependent upon completion of pre-professional coursework taken at CEI and other considerations set forth by the specific LC State instructional division.
- Students must provide proof of lawful presence as part of the admissions application process.
- If specific program/major prerequisites have not been met at CEI, those prerequisites may need to be met prior to acceptance into the Elementary Education program.
- CEI advisors may encourage students to enroll in the appropriate prerequisite course to satisfy associate degree requirements. Students may enroll in LC State classes while enrolled at CEI, subject to appropriate fee payment and financial aid requirements.
- Students who are enrolled in LC State classes while enrolled at CEI and receiving federal financial aid must work with the Financial Aid Offices at both institutions. Eligibility and specific processes will depend upon the number of credits a student takes at each institution.
- Students must complete a minimum total of 120 semester credits (some majors may require more) to graduate from LC State with a baccalaureate degree. A minimum of thirty-six (36) semester credits must be at the upper division level (300- and 400-level courses), and thirty-two (32) semester credits must be completed at LC State prior to graduation.
- No tuition will be assessed for transferred credit.



Renewal, Revision, Termination

This agreement is effective as of November 1, 2025, and will be reviewed for renewal every three (3) years on November 1. Either CEI or LC State upon written notice to the other institution may request revision of this agreement. Either institution, at any time during its term, may terminate the agreement for reasons of noncompliance via written notice to the other institution. Termination notice shall not be given less than 60 days prior to the end of the current term of the agreement.
