Video Platform Roll-out

eLearning is currently evaluating streaming video platforms, with the goal of purchasing a system that will integrate into Canvas and provide more robust features for video creation, editing, sharing, and student engagement. We're also focusing on platforms that will allow you to import existing videos you've published to YouTube, so you won't have to recreate content.



The launch of a new video platform will be what we call a "rolling" process. Once purchased, the tool will become available to all users in Canvas immediately, but transitioning existing video content to the new platform will happen over time. Your existing YouTube links and embeds will still work in your courses as you begin to move them to the new platform. And of course, eLearning will be here to assist you along the way! We'll be offering workshops through the CTL in the fall, and early adopters will be able to schedule with their Instructional Designer to learn the new tool when it's selected.

At this time, we encourage you to review your existing video content and remove outdated videos to aid in the transition process. We look forward to offering faculty and students an engaging and easy-to-use video platform in Canvas!
