As you may be aware, Dr. Luther Maddy, dean of the School of Professional & Graduate Studies, will be retiring at the conclusion of this fiscal year. After consultation with the Academic Affairs Council, Provost Chilson has proposed, and I have approved the interim leadership appointments illustrated through this organizational chart.

Additionally, LC State's seven-year accreditation review by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) site visit is scheduled for this fall. In light of this important review process, maintaining continuity and stability in our academic leadership is essential. To that end, the Provost and the Academic Affairs Council are confident that this interim structure will ensure consistent leadership and minimize disruption as we transition into the coming academic year.

Announcements

- **CAH Volunteers:** Due to a staffing shortage, the Center for Arts & History (CAH) is looking for volunteers from campus and/or the community to help staff the Center. Coverage is needed from Tuesday-Friday from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. No experience required. - CTE National Signing Day: It was another successful CTE National Signing Day at LC State! Read the release. Thank you to LC State's School of Career & Technical Education for making these students feel so welcome and for already connecting them with key industry partners!
- Fall Registration: Thanks to everyone who helped students prepare for Priority Registration Week! Every effort counts from advising students into their fall classes, holding advising and registration events, to reminding students to register. However, our work is not over yet! While a large percentage of our current, degree-seeking students registered from April 7-10, there are still over 700 students who have not completed their registration. We need to keep the momentum going. Please reach out to those who have not yet registered for fall classes and assist them in securing their spots. Detailed "Not Registered" lists will be posted for division chairs and admins by the end of this week. In the meantime, open registration for direct-to-division transfer and returning students began on Friday. Now is the time to actively engage with these students to ensure they are registered for fall 2025.
- **Fitness Center:** The Fitness Center will be closed April 14-20 for machine upgrades, painting, and projects related to the HVAC system that is being worked on above the facility.

• Hiyúumenwees: A new study space for all students has been opened in Reid Centennial Hall (RCH), Room 22. Connecting to LC State's long history with the Nez Perce Tribe, the space has been named Hiyúumenwees, which means "a bear's den" in Nez Perce. Piamkinwaas, which had a similar purpose, was taken offline in September 2024 to allow for required fire suppression and infrastructure updates. This facility is now being prepared to help address increased student housing demand (over the past three years LC State housing demand has exceeded capacity and necessitated the purchase of hotel rooms at a cost of nearly \$200,000 in fall 2024 alone). Administrators report that Hiyúumenwees, which is overseen by Native American & Veteran Student Services and Outreach, is already seeing steady use as it is centrally located on campus and in close proximity to the many student services in RCH. Campus is encouraged to stop by and check it out.

Athletics raised over \$100K for various programs, scholarships and operational needs (special thanks to the athletics staff, coaches and WAA who helped make Wake up with the Warriors another terrific success!). Student Affairs and academic units raised \$35,122 which was 15% more than last year's non-athletic totals! Well done and thank you! Thank you to our supporters, students, staff, and faculty who donated and advocated. It was a successful and well-attended event representing a tremendous collaborative effort to grow and promote our Secondary Ed programs.
- Open Enrollment: Open enrollment for medical, dental, and FSA benefits for employees will take
 place April 28-May 16. This is your annual opportunity to review and, if needed, make changes to
 your benefits. LC State's Human Resource Services office hasn't received any specific updates
 regarding plan or premium changes yet. However, it will include details in the Monday Message

- Steam Heat: With temperatures warming, Physical Plant is turning off steam heat today. The central steam boilers provide heat to Reid Centennial Hall, Administration Building, SUB/CSL, Music Building, Talkington Hall, and Meriwether Lewis Hall. Those using rooms in these buildings may experience cooler temperatures in the mornings and warmer temperatures in the afternoon. Please plan accordingly.
