Dear all,

First I want to give a shoutout of thanks and congratulations to Student Employment and Career Readiness. Our Career & Internship Fair was a terrific success! The event impact was exceptional with 627 participants (518 LC State students and 109 high school students), culminating in year-over-year growth of 13%! Our junior and senior student participation nearly doubled compared to last year and 27 students received job offers directly from the Fair employers (We had 63 different organizations represented at the Fair). A recap of student representation by the numbers appears below.

- 79 unique majors were represented
- Top programs by attendance:
 - 1. Nursing 118 students (23%)
 - 2. Health Studies 45 students (9%)
 - 3. Technical & Industrial (Auto, CNC, Welding, HVAC) 66 students (13%)
 - 4. Business Administration 25 students (5%)
 - 5. Computer Science/Cybersecurity 24 students (5%)
